### **Data Entry**

(Only personnel who have been given access and have received approved training in the use of the system are authorized to query or enter new data)

Supervisor reviews officer's documentation.





The system will automatically refresh and upload new data into the central database.

Individual is entered into the CalGang database as a gang member or an associate.
