Missing and Unidentified Persons Section (MUPS)





What We Do

Assist law enforcement and criminal justice agencies in:

- Locating missing persons
- Identifying unknown live and deceased persons

By comparing:

- Physical characteristics
- Fingerprints
- Dental/ body X-rays

How MUPS can assist the public

1-800-222-FIND (1-800-222-3463)

- Answer questions surrounding your loved one's disappearance
- > Recommend resources based on your loved one's case
- Assist in posting your loved one's information on the AG's public website
- Help to locate medical and dental records, x-rays, and samples





What to provide to MUPS

What is needed to help locate and identify your loved one:

- Photos of the missing person (including facial photos, tattoos, jewelry commonly worn, etc.)
- Dental and/or medical records (including x-rays)
- > Fingerprints from the missing person
- Military records
- * Only photos with permission will are made public





Who is considered a missing person?

In California, a missing person is someone whose whereabouts is unknown to the reporting party. This includes any child who may have run away, been taken involuntary or may be in need of assistance. It includes a child illegally taken, held or hidden by a parent or non-parent family member.





THERE IS NO WAITING PERIOD

The law enforcement agency (LEA) must immediately assist any person who is attempting to make a missing person report.

All California police and sheriff's departments must accept any report, including a report by telephone, of a missing person, including runaways, without delay and will give priority to the handling of the report.

Unidentified Deceased Persons

- Pursuant to California Government Code:
- § 27521.1: Initial report of deceased to DOJ within 10 days
- § 27521(j): Dental charting and x-rays to DOJ within 45 days
- § 27521(k): Final report to DOJ within 180 days






MUPS Investigative Services

- Provide investigative leads to LE, Coroners, and Medical Examiners utilizing various databases
- Search and compare physical descriptions in the Missing Persons
 System & Unidentified Persons System for possible matches
- Complete dental comparisons to missing persons
- > Facilitate fingerprint assistance and comparisons


