ENTERING PERMANENT
INJUNCTION AND DISMISSING
ACTION WITH PREJUDICE**

19 Plaintiffs in this matter are the Peace Officers Research Association of California, Brian
20 Marvel, the California Association of Highway Patrolmen, Jake Johnson, the California Police
21 Chiefs Association, and the California State Sheriffs’ Association. Defendants are the State of
22 California, the California Department of Justice, and Rob Bonta, in his official capacity as
23 Attorney General of California. Plaintiffs and Defendants are collectively referred to as “the
24 parties.”

25 Having reviewed the parties’ stipulation to resolve this action, the Court orders as follows:

- 26 1. The parties’ stipulation is granted.
- 27 2. Defendants and their agents, employees, and representatives are permanently
- 28 enjoined from enforcing section 999.226(a)(23) of Title 11 of the California Code of Regulations,

1 a regulation under the California Racial and Identity Profiling Act of 2015 (RIPA) that requires
2 certain law enforcement officers to document their gender identity when performing a stop.
3 (Gov. Code § 12525.5.)

4 3. Defendants and their agents, employees, and representatives are permanently
5 enjoined from requiring any individual required to comply with RIPA to provide the “gender of
6 officer,” as defined in section 999.226(a)(23) of Title 11 of the California Code of Regulations,
7 on any disclosures required by RIPA.

8 4. This order does not prohibit Defendants from developing and implementing future
9 RIPA regulations pursuant to section 12525.5 of the Government Code.


10 5. This action is dismissed with prejudice.

11 6. Judgment is entered in favor of Plaintiffs.

12 7. Each party will bear its own costs and attorneys’ fees.

13 IT IS SO ORDERED.
