

Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Bay 101 may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should Bay 101 advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEAR-001277) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to this gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Bay 101 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible games and time periods
- Requirements for qualifying hands
- Qualifying hands and corresponding jackpot prize amounts
- Availability of No Purchase Necessary
- Any other restrictions that apply to this jackpot

Eligible Controlled Games

The Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot shall be attached to all Bureau approved poker games offered at Bay 101 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as approved by the Bureau.

Object and Summary

The Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot features three progressive jackpot prizes. The Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot considers the best hand dealt to any player playing in any participating game during the predetermined and posted promotional period.

1. To determine qualifying hands, the following procedures will be followed for each attached poker game type:
 - a. Draw Poker style games:
 - i. For the base game, the players are each dealt five cards.
 - ii. Each player will use the five-card hand dealt for the base game as their five-card hand for the purpose of this gaming activity.
 - b. 7-Card Stud, 7-Card Stud High-Low style games:
 - i. For the base game, the players are each dealt three hole cards face-down and four cards face-up.
 - ii. Each player will use two hole cards and three up cards to complete their five-card hand for the purpose of this gaming activity.
 - iii. In the case of Four of a Kind (Quads), the hole cards used must be a pocket pair.
 - c. Flop games, e.g., Texas Hold'em, Omaha, Pineapple:
 - i. For the base game, the players are each dealt two, three, four or five hole cards. Five community cards are dealt on the board.
 - ii. Each player will use two hole cards and three community cards to complete their five-card hand for the purpose of this gaming activity.
 - iii. In the case of Four of a Kind (Quads), the hole cards used must be a pocket pair.
2. In the event that the qualifying hand was dealt to more than one player during the predetermined and posted period, the posted progressive jackpot amount will be evenly divided and distributed amongst the players with the qualifying hands.

Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot

- All prize amounts will be paid by a casino representative. Once the proper records have been completed, the casino representative will pay the winner(s) in live casino chips. All prize amounts will be reset and reseeded from the jackpot reserve fund.

Qualifying Hands

Players who make one of the following advertised qualifying hands, with all requirements satisfied, are eligible to win the posted prize amount. The qualifying hand(s) and corresponding prize amounts will be displayed prominently within Bay 101 Casino at all times while this gaming activity is being offered for play. All qualifying hands within a chart must be offered together at all times.

Poker Bonus Hands Qualifying Hand Chart

Qualifying Hand	Prize Amount
Royal Flush	\$10 – \$599
Straight Flush	\$10 – \$599
Four of a Kind (Quads)	\$10 – \$599

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the predetermined specified hours posted for the gaming activity.

- Players must be seated and playing at a designated table in order to qualify for this gaming activity.
- Players must be present to win a prize.
- Players have up to fifteen (15) minutes to present a valid ID and claim the prize. If the player cannot present their ID within the fifteen (15) minutes, the player has thirty (30) days to return and claim the prize. If the player does not claim the prize within the thirty (30) days, the prize will be returned to the prize fund.
- In order to qualify for this gaming activity, the player must use two hole cards in flop or stud game, or five cards in draw style games.
- There is a minimum of five players required to be seated and actively playing in an above mentioned game for the table to qualify for the jackpot.
- A minimum of \$20 must be in the pot of the attached controlled game in order for the table to qualify for this jackpot.
- In the event two or more players make a qualifying hand, each player with a qualifying hand will be eligible for the prize.
- When a qualifying hand is announced, a casino representative will verify both hands qualify. Any deviation from a standard deck will nullify the jackpot.
- The player(s) with the qualifying hands must complete the applicable bets on each round and play through the final betting round (the showdown) in order to qualify for the jackpot.
- A misdeal will disqualify any hand with regards to this gaming activity.
- Any discussion of this gaming activity during the play of the hand may be considered collusion which will disqualify the hand and void payment of the jackpot.
- There is no restriction on the number of times a player may qualify for or win a prize.
- Casino employees are eligible for this gaming activity when off duty and out of uniform.
- Tournament games do not qualify for the gaming activity.

Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot

Prize

Players who make the predetermined and posted qualifying hands shall be eligible to win the corresponding progressive prize amount. The prize will be paid out in live casino chips from the cage.

The Casino will initially seed the Royal Flush prize pool with an amount between \$10 and \$300. The Royal Flush prize pool will then increase daily by a range of \$1 to \$50. The Royal Flush prize pool will continue to increase until it reaches its cap of \$599.

The Casino will initially seed the Straight Flush prize pool with an amount between \$10 and \$250. The Straight Flush prize pool will then increase daily by a range of \$1 to \$50. The Straight Flush prize pool will continue to increase until it reaches its cap of \$599.

The Casino will initially seed the Four of a Kind prize pool with an amount between \$10 and \$200. The Four of a Kind prize pool will then increase daily by a range of \$1 to \$50. The Royal Flush prize pool will continue to increase until it reaches its cap of \$599.

The actual progressive jackpot prize pool amount will depend on the amount that the jackpot was originally seeded at, as well as how many days have transpired in order for the posted jackpot prize to increase progressively each day. Any additional jackpot fees collected each day shall be added to the jackpot reserve fund after the jackpot prize pools have been increased. In addition, once the cap is reached, any jackpot fees collected shall be added to the jackpot reserve fund. The jackpot reserve fund shall reseed the jackpot at an amount ranging from \$10 to \$598 after the jackpot is hit.

Funding

The Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot utilizes three progressive jackpot prize pools which will be player funded by a \$1 jackpot collection fee. During play of the attached controlled games, a \$1 jackpot collection fee will be collected from the poker pot during the play of attached controlled games, which is in addition to the regular house collection fee.

Each jackpot prize pool will be increased by \$1 to \$50 based on how many jackpot fees are collected that day with any additional collected jackpot fees going into the jackpot reserve fund in an amount between \$100 and \$5,000. The jackpot reserve fund shall be used to reseed the jackpot prize pools and pay administrative fees. If the Casino is required to reseed the jackpot or cover any shortfall due to inadequate funds, the Casino shall be reimbursed from the reserve fund once there are sufficient funds available.

Administrative Fees

The Casino will take an administrative fee of \$5 to \$20 per table per hour from the reserve fund. The administrative fee shall be utilized to cover expenses incurred by the gambling establishment for administering the Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot.

No Purchase Necessary

The Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot shall be offered to customers who wish to participate for free, on a general and indiscriminate basis, with **no restrictions**. The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for all patrons who request to participate in the gaming activity without paying a table fee or placing a live wager. All advertisement material shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot. This requirement extends to all forms of advertising including electronic message boards, computer monitors, posters, and flyers.

Dead Chip Promotion

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Bay 101 may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should the Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEAR-001322) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to this gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Bay 101 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible dates and time period(s) to purchase Dead Chips
- Eligible dates and time period(s) to use Dead Chips
- How to purchase the Dead Chip
- Necessary amount to buy Dead Chips, and the amount of additional chips that will be received
- How to wager and redeem the Dead Chip
- Eligible games and tables
- The maximum number of Dead Chip buy-ins available to purchase (if a limit is in place)
- Any other restrictions that apply to this gaming activity

Eligible Controlled Games

The Dead Chip Promotion shall be attached to all Bureau approved California games offered at Bay 101 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as approved by the Bureau.

Object and Summary

The Dead Chip promotion will award players who play during the pre-determined and specifically posted hours with an opportunity to purchase Dead Chips at a discount to the face value of the chip from the cashier cage. The Dead Chips can only be wagered with during pre-determined dates and times. Players who purchase Dead Chips will be eligible to wager the chips during the play of any Bureau approved California game offered at the Casino.

Example: *players will receive a fixed amount of \$60.00 in Dead Chips for the purchase price of \$30.00 in cash during live play.*

Dead Chips

Dead Chips will look significantly different from the live casino chips and they will be marked as a promotional dead chip and shall state “no cash value”. There will be a designated cage window for the purchase of Dead Chips. The dates, times and cage window number will be available in advance by the Casino. When a player buys-in to the Dead Chip Promotion, the cashier shall record the patron’s name, date and time of buy-in, buy-in amount, amount of Dead Chips issued/awarded to the player, and name of cashier processing the transaction.

- When the player wagers a Dead Chip and the hand loses, the Dead Chip will be collected by the player-dealer. A casino representative will collect the Dead Chip from the player-dealer and will then redeem the Dead Chips for live casino chips at the cage for full value and bring the live casino chips back to the player-dealer.

Dead Chip Promotion

- If the hand wins, the player will retain the Dead Chip(s) and any winning amount will be paid in live casino chips by the player-dealer. Dead Chips may be wagered on bonus bets.
- If the hand pushes, the chip(s) may be wagered again.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the pre-determined specified hours designated and posted for the gaming activity.

- Players cannot exchange Dead Chips for live casino chips or money. They can only be used to place a wager.
- A player may not combine any dead chips with live casino chips in order to place a wager.
- Dead Chips are intended to be used as a “multi-use” chip.
- Since Dead Chips have no cash value, unused chips are non-refundable.
- Dead Chips expire at the end of the promotional period. Expired Dead Chips cannot be used to wager or be exchanged for cash.
- Dead Chips are non-transferable between players.
- The player must pay any collection required for the play of the hand in live casino chips. Dead Chips cannot be used to pay any collection fees or jackpot fees.
- The promotion will be open only to the players who have purchased Dead Chips, seated and playing at an eligible game during the pre-determined and specified hours designated for the promotion.
- The Casino may place a limit on the maximum number of Dead Chip buy-ins. When a limit applies, the promotion will be awarded on a first-come, first serve basis.
 - **Example:** *The promotional period is from 7pm to 9pm and it is offered to the first 100 players.*
- Dead Chips are available for purchase only during the pre-designated day/hour selected and posted at the Casino.
- There is no maximum amount of Dead Chips that may be used per player, per hand; as long as table limits are followed.
- Backline bettors are allowed to wager with the Dead Chip if the controlled game rules allow for backline betting.
- Dead Chips may be used for base game wagers as well as bonus bets.
- During a round of play, Dead Chips may not be wagered on opposite base bets (e.g. Player and Banker in Baccarat). The first Dead Chip wager placed for that round of play will determine which bets may be wagered with Dead Chips.
 - **Example:** *if the first Dead Chip wager is placed on Player, then all Banker bets must be in live casino chips for that hand.*
- Casino employees are eligible to purchase and use Dead Chips when off duty and out of uniform.
- The player-dealer position is not allowed to wager with or payout any winnings with Dead Chips.
- Third-Party Provider of Proposition Player Services (TPPPS) are not eligible to participate in this promotion as a player.

Dead Chip Promotion

Prize

The Dead Chip gaming activity features a fixed prize element ranging in value from \$5 to \$20,000 in the form of promotional Dead Chips, as pre-determined and designated by the Casino.

Funding

The Dead Chip Promotion is house funded by Bay 101. There shall be no additional promotion fees, jackpot fees, or collection fees taken in order to fund this gaming activity or for players to participate.

Administrative Fees

Bay 101 shall not retain any additional administrative fee for this gaming activity as the promotion is house funded.

No Purchase Necessary

The Dead Chip Promotion does not contain the element of chance. Therefore, it does not constitute an illegal lottery and does not require a No Purchase Necessary table to be offered while conducting this gaming activity.

Match Play Promotion

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Bay 101 Casino may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should the Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEAR-001278) will be referenced on all advertisements relating to this gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, will be prominently displayed in Bay 101 Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible dates and time periods
- Eligible games
- Procedures to redeem Match Play Coupon(s) or Free Play Chip(s)
- Match Play Coupon(s) and Free Play Chip(s) amounts
- Match Play Coupon(s) expiration date(s)
- Redemption Fee
- Any other restrictions that apply to this gaming activity

Eligible Controlled Games

The Match Play Promotion will be attached to all Bureau approved California games offered at Bay 101 Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules will be played as approved by the Bureau.

Object and Summary

Patrons are awarded Match Play Coupons, Free Play Vouchers or Bonus Play Vouchers via advertisements in magazines, websites, mailing advertisements, winning a Bureau approved promotion, winning or signing up for a Bureau approved tournament. Players who receive a Match Play or Free/Bonus Play coupons will be eligible to win the specific amount on the coupon or chip. Players will not exchange the Match Play Coupons or Free Play Chips for live casino chips. All applicable collection fees will be paid when using a Free Play Chip or Match Play Coupon. Free Play Chips and Match Play Coupons may not be used to pay collection fees or jackpot fees and may be subject to a redemption fee.

Match Play Coupon

The Casino will offer Match Play Coupons having a face value ranging from \$5 to \$500 per coupon. The following will be clearly stated on the coupon: amount, qualifying attached controlled game(s), promotional period and any redemption fee.

A player will take a Match Play Coupon to an eligible game and place a wager that equals the amount on the coupon.

- The player must place a wager equal to the amount of the Match Play Coupon. The Match Play Coupons must be placed with the Player's wager. Any collection fees for the wager and/or redemption fee for the voucher must be posted by the player.
- Match Play Coupons may be used only on the base game wager of the eligible controlled game listed on the coupon.
- During a round of play, Match Play Coupons may not be used on opposite base game wagers, e.g. player and banker in EZ Baccarat.

Match Play Promotion

- If a player uses a Match Play Coupon and wins the hand, the player will receive the combined value of the Match Play Coupon and the equal wager placed by the player, paid by the player-dealer. The Match Play Coupon will be verified and cancelled by a casino representative and then collected by the player-dealer. Winning Match Play Coupons will be taken to the cage by a casino representative and will be exchanged for live casino chips totaling the value listed on the coupon(s). The live casino chips will be brought back to the player-dealer.
- If a player uses a Match Play Coupon and loses the hand, the player will lose the Match Play Coupon as well as their equal live casino chip portion. The player-dealer will be paid the live chip wager of the bet. The Match Play Coupon will be collected and voided.
- If a player uses a Match Play Coupon and the hand pushes, the player will retain both the Match Play Coupon as well as the equal live chip wager to be used again until he or she wins or loses.

Example: A player receives a Match Play Coupon with a value of \$10 for any California game, promotional period current and unexpired and a \$1 redemption fee for the Match Play Coupon. The player places the coupon on the gaming table with a \$10 live casino chip along with the Match Play Coupon. The player will also pay the \$1 regular collection fee for live chip wager and a \$1 redemption fee for the Match Play Coupon. If the player wins the hand, the player will win \$10 for their base game wager and \$10 for the Match Play Coupon. The player-dealer shall collect the verified and cancelled coupon and present to a casino representative. The casino representative will log the coupon and exchange it for \$10 in live casino chips.

Free Play Chip(s)

The Casino will offer Free Play Chip(s) having a value ranging from \$5 to \$500. The Free Play Chip(s) are used in live games exactly like regular live casino chips, the difference being they cannot be exchanged for cash. Free Play Chips will initially be in the form of a voucher, which will be offered to all patrons that wish to come to the Casino and use them to play. The following will be clearly stated on the voucher: amount, eligible controlled game(s), promotional period and any redemption fee. When a patron receives a Free Play voucher they will present the voucher to a casino representative to be verified, logged, and redeemed for Free Play Chip(s) to be used in a live game. Free Play Chips will be used as the player's wager on the betting circle. Free Play Chips will not be taken into the house dealer's tray, nor will they be paid from the house dealer's tray.

- Free Play Chip(s) may be used only on the base game wager of the eligible controlled game listed on the voucher.
- During a round of play, Free Play Chip(s) may not be used on opposite base game wagers, e.g. player and banker in EZ Baccarat.
- If a player uses a Free Play Chip and wins the hand, the player will receive the value of the Free Play Chip in live casino chips, paid by the player-dealer. The Free Play Chip is taken to the cage by the casino representative, logged and exchanged for the value listed on the chip. The live casino chips will be brought back to the player-dealer.
- If the player who played the Free Play Chip loses the hand, the Free Play Chip will be given to the player-dealer. A casino representative will verify the chip has been played. The Free Play Chip will then be collected by the house dealer and dropped into the drop box for accounting purposes.
- If the player pushes (receives no action) the hand, the Free Play Chips may be played again until the player wins or loses the hand.

Match Play Promotion

Example: A player receives a Free Play voucher with a stated value of \$10 to play on any California game, promotional period current and unexpired with a \$1 redemption fee. The player redeems the coupon for \$10 Free Play Chip(s). The player places the \$10 Free Play Chip(s) on the gaming table as a base game wager. The player also posts a \$1 redemption fee. If the player wins the hand, the player will win \$10 in live casino chips for their base game wager. The player-dealer will collect the verified Free Play Chip(s) and present them to a casino representative. The casino representative will log the Free Play Chip(s) and exchange it for \$10 in live casino chips.

Bonus Play Chip(s)

The Casino will offer Bonus Play Chip(s) having a value ranging from \$5 to \$500. The Bonus Play Chip(s) are used in live games exactly like regular live casino chips, the difference being they cannot be exchanged for cash. Bonus Play Chips will initially be in the form of a voucher. The following will be clearly stated on the voucher: amount, eligible controlled game(s), promotional period and any redemption fee. When a patron receives a Bonus Play voucher they will present the voucher to a casino representative to be verified, logged, and redeemed for Bonus Play Chip(s) to be used in a live game. Bonus Play Chips will be used as the player's wager on the betting circle. Bonus Play Chips will not be taken into the house dealer's tray, nor will they be paid from the house dealer's tray.

- Bonus Play Chip(s) may be used only on the base game wager of the eligible controlled game listed on the voucher.
- During a round of play, Bonus Play Chip(s) may not be used on opposite base game wagers, e.g. player and banker in EZ Baccarat.
- If a player uses a Bonus Play Chip and wins the hand, the player will receive the value of the Bonus Play Chip in live casino chips, paid by the player-dealer.
- If the player who played the Bonus Play Chip loses the hand, the Bonus Play Chip will be given to the player-dealer. A casino representative will verify the chip has been played. The Bonus Play Chip is taken to the cage by the casino representative, logged and exchanged for the value listed on the chip. The live casino chips will be brought back to the player-dealer.
- If the player pushes (receives no action) the hand, the Bonus Play Chips may be played again until the player wins or loses the hand.

Example: A player receives a Bonus Play voucher with a stated value of \$10 to play on any California game, promotional period current and unexpired with a \$1 redemption fee. The player redeems the voucher for \$10 Bonus Play Chip(s). The player places the \$10 Bonus Play Chip(s) on the gaming table as a base game wager. The player also posts a \$1 redemption fee. If the player wins the hand, the player will win \$10 in live casino chips for their base game wager and retain the Bonus Play Chip(s) to be played again. If the player loses the hand, the player-dealer will collect the verified Bonus Play Chip(s) and present them to a casino representative. The casino representative will log the Bonus Play Chip(s) and exchange it for \$10 in live casino chips.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity will be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the pre-determined specified hours designated and posted for the gaming activity.

Match Play Promotion

- A minimum of two players, a player and a player-dealer, are required in order for the table to qualify for this promotion.
- Backline bettors are eligible to participate and win in this promotion.
- There is no limit to the number of times Free Play Chips or Match Play Coupons that can be used.
- Players may not exchange coupons or vouchers for live casino chips or give them to another player. Coupons or vouchers are only redeemable by the player-dealer.
- Only one coupon or voucher may be used per base game wager placed. Furthermore, a voucher may not be applied to more than one wager.
- Casino employees are eligible to participate and win in this promotion when off duty and out of uniform.
- The player-dealer position is eligible to win Free Play Chips or match play coupons, but cannot use them as a wager.
- Bonus Play Chips, Free Play Chips nor Match Play Coupons cannot be used on bonus bets.
- Tournament games do not qualify for this promotion.
- Bonus Play Chips, Free Play Chips and Match Play Coupons are still subject to collection fees.
- Match Play Coupons expire and the expiration date will be clearly displayed.

Prize

The Match Play Coupons, Free Play Chips, and/or Bonus Play Chips will have a fixed value ranging from \$5 to \$500. The coupons and chips may only be redeemed after having been played and verified by a casino representative.

Funding

The Match Play Promotion will be fully funded by Bay 101 Casino. The Casino will charge a redemption fee to each player who wishes to use the Match Play Promotion. The redemption fee will be charged at the table that the player wishes to use the coupon/chip(s), and will be payable in the form of live casino chips. The fee will be collected after the coupon is placed on the table, and prior to the hand being dealt. The amount of the fee must be clearly posted on all advertisements, printed flyers, digital displays, Casino website, etc.

Administrative Fees

There will be no administrative fee(s) collected for this promotion, as it is house funded.

No Purchase Necessary

The Match Play Promotion does not contain the element of chance. Therefore, it does not constitute an illegal lottery and does not require a No Purchase Necessary table to be offered while conducting this gaming activity.

Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Bay 101 Casino may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should the Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEAR-001274) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to this gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Bay 101 Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Qualifying Games
- Eligible dates and time periods
- Qualifying hands
- Prize payout structure
- The prize amount that will be awarded
- No Purchase Necessary opportunity
- Any other restrictions that apply

Eligible Controlled Games

The Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot shall be attached to the following Bureau approved controlled games offered at Bay 101 Casino, as shown below, at all times this gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

- Three Card Poker 6 Card Bonus (GEGA-004086)
- Ultimate Texas Hold'em Bad Beat Bonus (GEGA-004177)
- Crazy 4 Poker (GEGA-004555)

All controlled game rules will be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

Object and Summary

The Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot features a progressive jackpot prize and fixed prize amounts. The Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot considers the best hand possible among each individual player's cards.

1. To begin each round, players must place their regular base game wager. Players may optionally place any bonus bet wagers along with the optional \$1 jackpot fee.
2. Players must place the optional jackpot fee in a designated jackpot space prior to the deal to indicate their participation in the progressive jackpot.
 - a. When "hockey puck" discs are used, they will be attached to the table in front of each betting position. A sensor in the disc will detect when a casino chip is placed on them. Players must place the optional jackpot fee on the sensor. The sensor will then light up.
 - b. When two designated jackpot spaces are used in one betting position, one is designated for the player's hand and the other is designated for the player-dealer's hand.

Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot

3. Once all players place their bets and the optional jackpot fee, the house dealer will enter the start of the round on the keypad. The sensors will then light up, indicating participation in the progressive jackpot. The house dealer will then remove all jackpot fees from the table. The jackpot fees are dropped in a separate and locked jackpot collection box attached to the table.
 - a. If a sensor fails to light up, the house dealer will utilize a button to indicate participation in the progressive jackpot.
4. The house dealer will then follow standard approved procedures for dealing the attached controlled game.
5. To determine qualifying hands for the progressive jackpot, the following procedures will be followed for each attached controlled game:
 - a. Three Card Poker:
 - i. For the base game, the players and the player-dealer are each dealt three cards.
 - ii. After all players and the player-dealer have received their hands, one additional hand of three cards will be placed to the side of the house dealer.
 - iii. One card will be burned, removed from play and discarded.
 - iv. The two remaining cards are combined with the player or player-dealer's three-card hand to complete their five-card hand for the purpose of the progressive jackpot.
 - b. Ultimate Texas Hold'em:
 - i. For the base game, the players and the player-dealer are each dealt two cards. Five community cards are dealt in the center of the table.
 - ii. Each player or player-dealer will use their two cards combined with the three-card flop (first three community cards) as their five-card hand for the purpose of the progressive jackpot.
 - c. Crazy 4 Poker:
 - i. For the base game, the players and the player-dealer are each dealt five cards.
 - ii. Each player or player-dealer will use the five-card hand dealt for the base game as their five-card hand for the purpose of the progressive jackpot.
6. Progressive Winners:
 - a. Qualifying bonus hands with a progressive meter payout will be paid from the progressive jackpot prize pool in the amount shown on the progressive meter.
 - b. If the player-dealer hand qualifies for a progressive prize, the amount of the progressive jackpot prize will be divided among all players who placed a fee for the player-dealer's hand.

 - h. The progressive meter will be adjusted appropriately for the prize(s) won.
7. Fixed Prizes:

Eligibility Requirements

The prize will be awarded to a player when they have made the pre-determined and designated winning qualifying hand(s) during the pre-determined and specified promotional period.

Prize Amount

The jackpot prize pool is progressive with a minimum amount of \$1,000 and a maximum amount of \$250,000. The jackpot prize will be paid in the form of cash, check or casino chips. The actual progressive jackpot prize pool amount will depend on the amount that the jackpot was originally seeded at, as well as how many days have transpired in order for the posted jackpot prize to increase progressively each day by a range of \$25 to \$2,500.

Funding

The Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot utilizes a progressive jackpot prize pool which will be player funded by a \$1 jackpot fee. During play of the attached controlled games, a \$1 jackpot fee will be collected from each player participating in this gaming activity, which is in addition to the regular house collection fee. The Casino will initially seed the progressive jackpot prize pool with a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$100,000. Object and Summary

The Prize Wheel Promotion awards players with the opportunity to spin the prize wheel and win prizes ranging from \$10 to \$150,000. - Funding will be provided from the Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot (GEAR-001277)

Eligible Controlled Games

The Poker High Hand Bonus shall be attached to all Bureau approved poker games offered at Bay 101 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as approved by the Bureau.

Object and Summary

The Poker High Hand Bonus features a fixed prize amount in the range of \$10 to \$10,000. The Poker High Hand Bonus considers the best hand dealt to any player playing in any participating game during the predetermined and posted promotional period.

1. At the beginning of the predetermined and posted period, when a player has a Three of a Kind or higher, a casino representative will verify the "High Hand".
2. After the hand is verified, the player's name and the qualifying hand will be posted.

Object and Summary

The Aces Cracked Promotion features a fixed prize element attached to Texas Hold'em. A prize is awarded to players participating in an eligible game when a hand containing a pocket Pair of aces is beaten by a better hand at the showdown. In all instances, patrons shall be provided with ample advance notice of the rules and restrictions in order to qualify for the Aces Cracked Promotion.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the predetermined specified hours posted for the gaming activity.

- There is a minimum of five players required to be dealt in during a qualifying game in order for players to be eligible and the table to qualify for the promotional prize.

1. To begin each round, players must make their regular base game wager. Players may optionally place any bonus bets and optional \$1 jackpot fee. Players who do not make a base game wager are not eligible to place a jackpot fee.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the predetermined specified hours designated and posted for the gaming activity.

- A minimum of two seated players, the player and the player-dealer, are required to be dealt in the base game to be eligible for the jackpot.
- A player may qualify for the jackpot regardless of the outcome of the controlled game.
- There is no limit on the number of times a player may win a prize during any given promotional period.
- Casino employees are eligible to participate in the gaming activity when they are off duty.
- Backline bettors are eligible for this promotion.

1. \$0.11 will be immediately posted on the progressive meter.
2. \$0.89 will be tracked in a reserve fund.

Bay 101 Casino will initially seed the jackpot at a minimum of \$1,000 to a maximum of \$50,000. Once there are sufficient monies in the reserve fund, the initial seed amount will be reimbursed to the Casino from the reserve fund and shall be documented in the accounting records. Equipment

The electronic software and digital reader related to and used in conjunction with this gaming activity has been tested, approved, and certified by the Gaming Laboratories International, LLC (GLI).

1. Once the casino verifies the progressive win, the supervisor will press the confirm button. To complete the action, a casino representative's card swipe is required. This records the win onto the Game Manager computer and adjusts the meter appropriately for the prize won. House procedures are then followed for paying the prize. (Reviewing the monitor connected to the Game Manager will show the prize amount to be paid, and pressing the "money bag" icon will print a win page, which can be used to help record the payout for accounting.)
2. Once the house dealer reconciles all action, the house dealer presses "End Game." This resets the system to begin the next hand.
3. Once the casino representative's card is swiped the prize is logged into Game Manager. If the progressive pay needs to be backed out at this point, the prize will need to be manually backed out using the Game Manager manual adjustment feature.

Object and Summary

The No Limit Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot (jackpot) features a player-funded progressive prize. The object of the jackpot is for a player to form a qualifying hand that is beaten by a better hand at the showdown of the base game. .

To participate in the jackpot players will need to participate in an eligible game, at a table with five active players or more. Players shall place their wagers according to the base game rules, after all initial wagers have been placed, the house dealer will collect a \$1 jackpot fee from the pot. The jackpot fee will be collected at the same time as the collection rates for the base game. After the jackpot fee has been collected the house dealer will follow approved procedures for dealing the base game.

When the winning and losing hands are confirmed, those players with qualifying hands shall receive the posted percentage of the jackpot prize pool amount, as shown in the Prize Payout Structure below.

- Players who obtain a qualifying Losing Hand shall win the corresponding percentage of the prize pool, depending on the selected prize payout structure option.
 - If multiple players obtain a qualifying Losing Hand, only the highest ranked Losing Hand will win the Losing Hand share of the prize pool.
 - If multiple players obtain the same qualifying Losing Hand, all eligible players will win and evenly split the Losing Hand share of the prize pool.
 - If there is an odd number of chips the casino will make up the short fall and will be reimbursed from the reserve fund once there are sufficient funds.
 - Players who obtain and win the qualifying Losing Hand will not be eligible for the Table Share.
- Players who obtain a qualifying Winning Hand shall win the corresponding percentage of the prize pool, depending on the selected prize payout structure option.
 - If multiple players obtain a qualifying Winning Hand, only the highest ranked Winning Hand will win the Winning Hand share of the prize pool.
 - If multiple players obtain the same qualifying Winning Hand, all eligible players will win and evenly split the Winning Hand share of the prize pool.
 - If there is an odd number of chips the casino will make up the short fall and will be reimbursed from the reserve fund once there are sufficient funds.
 - Players who obtain and win the qualifying Winning Hand will not be eligible for the Table Share.
- Active players who are at the same table where the qualifying losing and winning hands are obtained, will evenly split the Table Share percentage of the prize pool, depending on the selected prize payout structure option.
 - If there is an odd number of chips the casino will make up the short fall and will be reimbursed from the reserve fund once there are sufficient funds.

Funding

The Limit Bad Beat Jackpot consists of a player-funded fixed prize pool. During all eligible games, when five or more players are dealt in on a hand, a \$1 jackpot fee is taken from the pot and then placed in a separate and locked jackpot fee box, which will be apart from the regular house collection fees. Proceeds from the jackpot fee will be deposited into the Limit Bad Beat Jackpot Reserve Fund.

Limit Bad Beat Jackpot

The casino shall initially seed the jackpot with an amount ranging between \$1,000 and \$75,000. When the jackpot prize has been awarded, the jackpot prize pool will be re-seeded at an amount between \$1,000 and \$150,000, from the reserve fund. If there are not sufficient funds in the reserve fund, the casino will make up the short fall.

Additionally, whenever the Casino is required to seed the jackpot prize pool or cover a shortfall due to inadequate funds in the reserve fund, the Casino shall be reimbursed from the reserve fund once sufficient funds become available.

All fee collections and table limits for the designated controlled game are Bureau approved, pre-determined and posted at each table.

Administrative Fees

The Casino shall retain an administrative fee of \$5 to \$20 per table per hour. The administrative fee shall be taken from the reserve fund. This fee shall cover the costs associated with prizes, administering and accounting for the jackpot.

No Purchase Necessary

The Limit Bad Beat Jackpot shall be offered to customers who wish to participate for free, on a general and indiscriminate basis, with **no restrictions**. The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for all patrons who request to participate in the gaming activity without paying a table fee or placing a live wager. All advertisement material shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the Limit Bad Beat Jackpot. This requirement extends to all forms of advertising including electronic message boards, computer monitors, posters, and flyers.

Poker Tournaments

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Bay 101 Casino may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should the Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GETR-000056) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to the gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the Poker Tournament and associated gaming activities, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Bay 101 Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- How a player may enter the tournament
- The game(s) offered during the play of the tournament
- The fees charged for entering the tournament, including a description for each fee charged and whether it shall be retained by Bay 101 Casino, added directly into the tournament prize pool, or any other method of retention or distribution
- The amount of tournament chips that will be awarded to each player upon entry into the tournament
- The tournament prize structure offered and the number of players that will be paid.
- When the patron(s) will be paid and the manner in which they will be paid
- Any other restrictions that apply to the Poker Tournament

Gaming Activities Played with Tournaments

- Advertising for bounties will be prominently posted with the prize amount and how the bounties will be funded
- The bounties will be paid during the tournament or as soon as their tournament play ends
- In the event of a tie, the bounty will be split among the players with the highest hands
- The bounty money may be deducted from the tournament prize pool or may be guaranteed and paid for by Bay 101 Casino
- If the designated bounty target does not get eliminated from the tournament, they will keep the bounty
- Patrons shall be given notice of the activity prior to the tournament being offered
- Tournament staff collects, verifies and copies current ID's of winning players and enters them into the tournament system
- Winning players will exchange their chips at the cage for cash or a check

Tournament Log

Bay 101 Casino will maintain a completed tournament log for at least seven years. These logs shall be maintained in a paper or electronic format. The cardroom shall also retain and make available the most recent three months of tournament logs for inspection by a representative of the Bureau during all hours of operation. Upon request of the Bureau, a licensee shall provide the Bureau with copies of such tournament logs. Tournament logs shall contain the following information:

- The name of the gambling establishment
- The day, date, time and name advertised for the tournament
- The total number of tables used
- The names of the controlled games offered
- The method of entry

Poker Tournaments

- The number and amount of rebuys and/or add-ons offered
- The number of participants
- The name of each fee charged, amount of each fee charged, total number of each fee collected and cumulative amount of collected
- The source of all funds for the tournament prize pool
- The amount of the prize pool
- The amount and reason for any deduction from the total collected prize pool
- The name of gaming activities offered (when applicable):
 - Funding source
 - Prize amount
 - Total number of prizes awarded
 - Total amount deducted from the prize pool (when applicable)
- The results of the tournament, including the amount paid out and amount paid for each place in the tournament
- The signature of casino staff responsible for administering the tournament

Eligible Controlled Games

The controlled games that may be played during Poker Games Tournaments at the Bay 101 Casino shall only be those as listed below. All controlled game rules shall be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

Gaming Activities Offered During Tournament Play

Bounties

Bounty targets are tournament players designated at the discretion of the Tournament Director. If a bounty target loses all of their tournament chips during a hand of play and is eliminated from the tournament, the winner of that hand shall collect a bounty. If the bounty target is not eliminated, then they shall collect their own bounty.

- Bounties may be offered to tournament patrons who pay the buy-in and entry fee.
- If Player X knocks out a bounty target by ending their play in the tournament, then Player X will be awarded a bounty prize.
- The bounty prize will be paid to Player X during the tournament or as soon as their tournament play ends. The Casino will determine which method to use.

Poker Tournaments

- Bounties are funded by the tournament prize pool. The bounty prize amount(s) will be deducted from the total number of buy-ins, rebuy(s) and add-on(s)
- The bounty prize amount will range from \$0 to \$500,000.
- If the group of remaining players decide to split the prize pool among themselves, the remaining bounty prizes will become part of the total split.
- There is no minimum or maximum number of players required for this gaming activity.

Tournament Entry

- Tournament entry is open to all customers.
- The specific structure shall be in any and all advertisements and must be made available to patrons prior to the start of the tournament. The structure of a tournament shall not change once sign-ups begin.
- **Promotional materials shall not advertise gender-based discounts nor imply gender-based entrance policy.**
- Patrons may enter a tournament by paying the buy-in and entry fee. All fees, prices charged, and the amount of tournament chips provided shall be equal and posted for all players.
- Entry may be earned by winning a previous tournament, playing in a daily tournament, and winning entry into a satellite event. All gaming activities and /or promotions shall be approved by the Bureau prior to being offered for tournament play.
- More than one method of entry for a specific tournament may be utilized.

Tournament Structure

*The entry fee shall be retained by the Bay 101 Casino for hosting the tournament. This fee shall not be included in the tournament prize pool.

Tournament Prize Amounts & Source of Funds

The prizes will be cumulative amount of buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons. The prizes may also be guaranteed. The cardroom may provide prizes or add funds to the prize pool for special events.

- When the prize amount is guaranteed, the payouts will be a cash value ranging from \$5-\$1,000,000. The cash will be paid to players from the buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons. If there is not enough cash to cover the guaranteed prize amount, Bay 101 Casino will fund the difference.
- When the prize pool is not based solely on buy-ins, re-buys and add-ons (free roll), Bay 101 Casino will determine and set the payout structure.

Regular Prize Pool

- The prize pot may consist of the sum of all buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons for each event, and the payouts shall be a percentage.
- Fixed payouts with Equally Distributed Remainders

Poker Tournaments

- This structure will allow the distribution of a specific prize, or group of prizes, of fixed values. The maximum number of items is distributed with any remaining prize monies equally to those players who won the items.
- To determine the number of winners, divide the total prize money by the value of the prize being given out (quotient). The quotient is the number of winners that will be eligible for that specific tournament. The remainder, which is the prize money less the guaranteed prize(s) being given out, is then divided by the quotient to determine the amount of additional prize monies each winner will receive.
- Patrons will be given ample notice of what prize is being offered and it will be displayed prominently via printed flyers, digital display, and any other forms of advertisements.

Tournament Prize Structure

When the prize is not guaranteed, the prize structure will be broken down by the number of paid entries and percentage paid. The percentage paid out will always equal 100%. In the event the players decide to forgo the payout structure and “split” the total prize pool amongst themselves, it shall be permitted and shall be noted in detail on the casino’s tournament log.

- The prize pool will be awarded via a flat amount or percentage. Whether a flat amount or percentage, the casino will clearly and prominently display such method prior to offering the tournament.
- The prize(s) may be a fixed cash amount, live casino chips, promotional chips (GEAR-001322, GEAR-001278), coupons, vouchers, tournament entries, extra tournament chips, or merchandise such as: clothing, jewelry, electronics, gift certificates, sport tickets, concert tickets, travel tickets, food comps, watercrafts, and vehicles.

World Series of Poker Tournament

The Bay 101 Casino may guarantee entry into any tournament event, such as the World Series of Poker Tournament (W.S.O.P.). Rather than the first place tournament winner receiving a percentage of the prize pool, they will receive entry into the W.S.O.P. In addition to entry fees and buy-ins, a travel allowance may be included for out of area tournaments.

Entities Involved Other than the House

At any time, Bay 101 Casino may offer a charity tournament that would include other organizations. These organizations shall be reputable and federally recognized as non-profit or charity organizations. These organizations will not be involved in running the tournament; however, their name may be used in conjunction with the advertising and promoting of the event. Bay 101 may donate prizes such as entries into Bay 101 Casino’s tournament is no cost to the charity. Charity tournaments may be structured where all or part of the buy-in, re-buy and add-on monies may be designated to go to a specified charity, in lieu of being paid out to winners. This shall be pre-determined and clearly posted on any and all advertisements.

No Purchase Necessary

The gaming activities attached to the Poker Tournaments shall be offered for free, on a general and indiscriminant basis, with no restrictions, to patrons who wish to participate in a No Purchase Necessary (NPN) game. The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for patrons who request to participate in the gaming activities attached to the Poker Tournaments without paying any entry into the tournament. The NPN player must adhere to all rules as the tournament player. All advertisements shall state “No Purchase Necessary” when referencing the gaming activities offered during the Poker Tournaments.
