## California Department of Justice Proposition 69 DNA Data Bank Program Report Fourth Quarter 2024

The California Department of Justice, Division of Law Enforcement, Bureau of Forensic Services (BFS) CAL-DNA Data Bank Program provides DNA typing services to support California's law enforcement agencies by managing and administering the state's DNA data bank. All BFS DNA programs, including the CAL-DNA Data Bank, are accredited by the ANSI National Accreditation Board (ANAB). Seventeen local crime laboratories and seven BFS laboratories/sections submit evidence DNA profiles for search against the CAL-DNA Data Bank and the National DNA Index System, which are part of the federal Combined DNA Index System (CODIS).

On November 3, 2004, California voters passed Proposition 69 to expand and modify the State's DNA database law. In accordance with the requirements of Penal Code (PC) section 295(h)(4), the following statistics have been prepared based on the last quarter for which complete information exists.
