

The Case for Reparations in Vallejo, CA

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Highlights

1. Vallejo is the home of numerous historic Black neighborhoods that are under threat of gentrification and rapid displacement.

-Housing Discrimination/Eminent Domain/Unhoused Crises

2. Vallejo is located in Solano County, the highest Black population in California per capita (16.87%).

-Transgenerational Effects of Concentrated Poverty/Health Harms

3. “Officers with the Vallejo Police Department killed 19 people from 2010 to 2020, but no Vallejo police officer has been found to be criminally liable for killing a civilian while on duty.” (AB3121 Interim Report, 116)

-Mass Incarceration/Sentencing/Unwarranted Police Violence

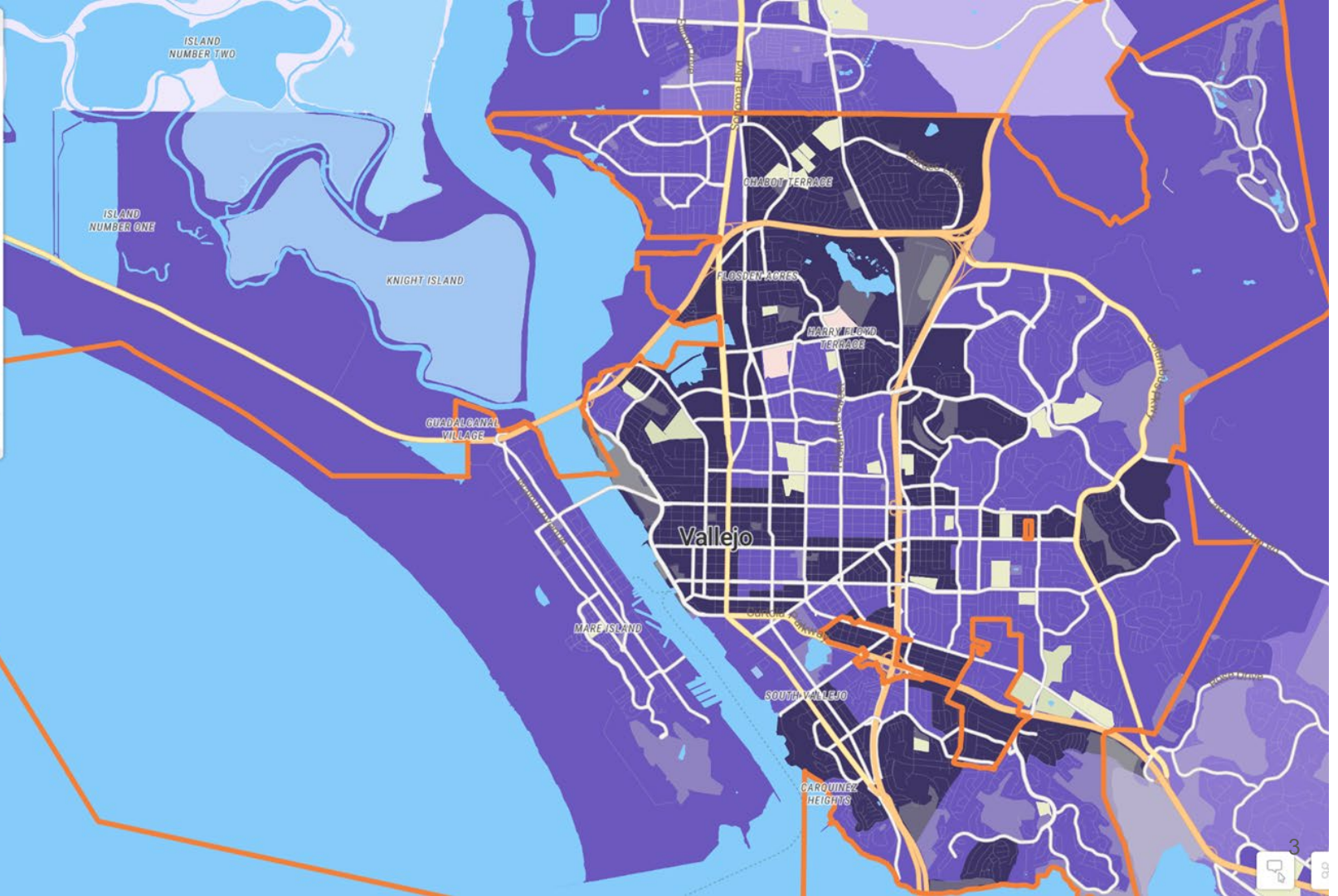

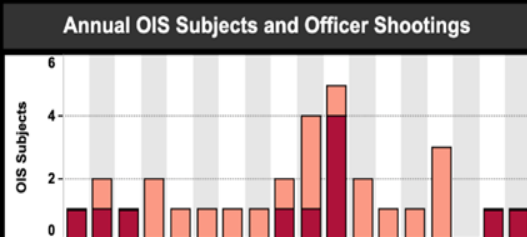

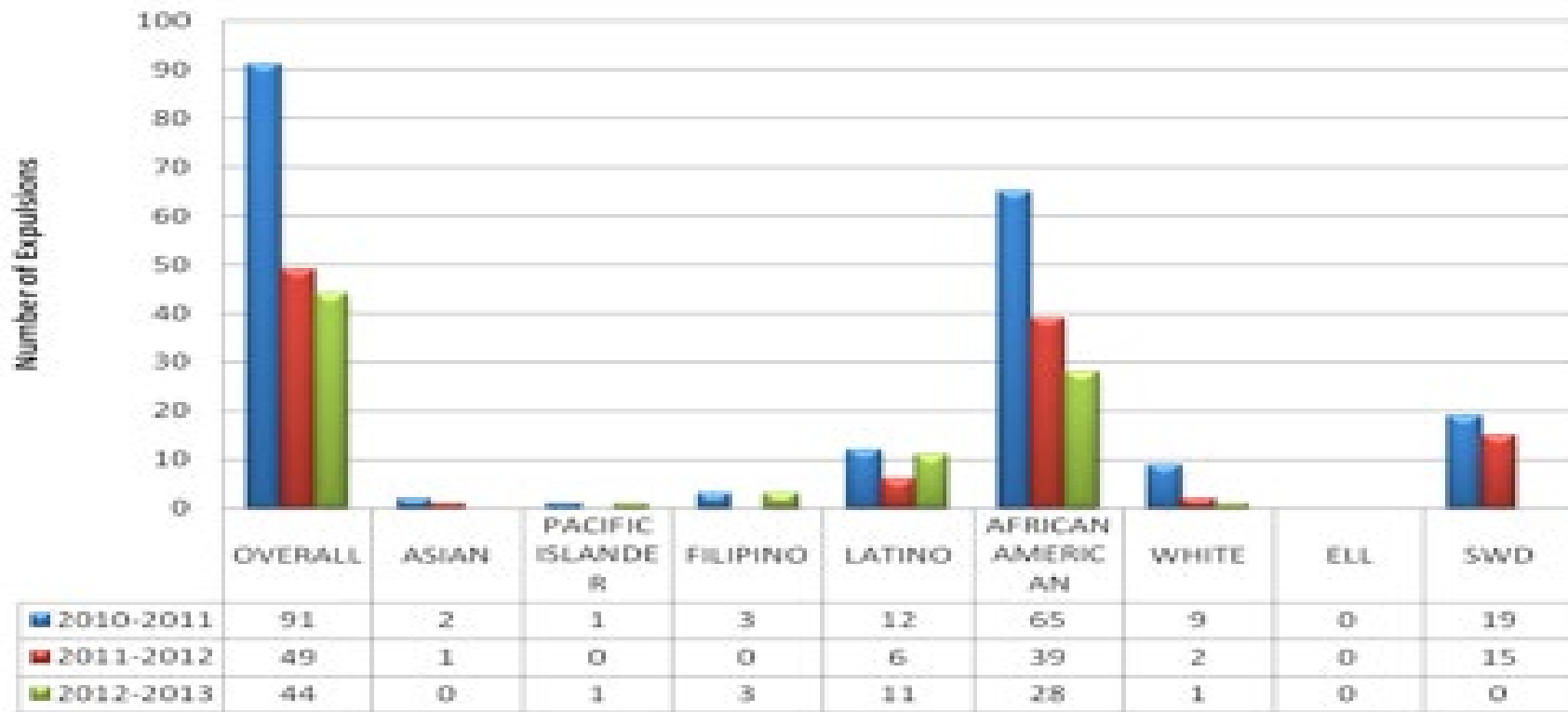


VCUSD Suspensions by Group 2011-2013

VCUSD Expulsions by Group 2011-2013



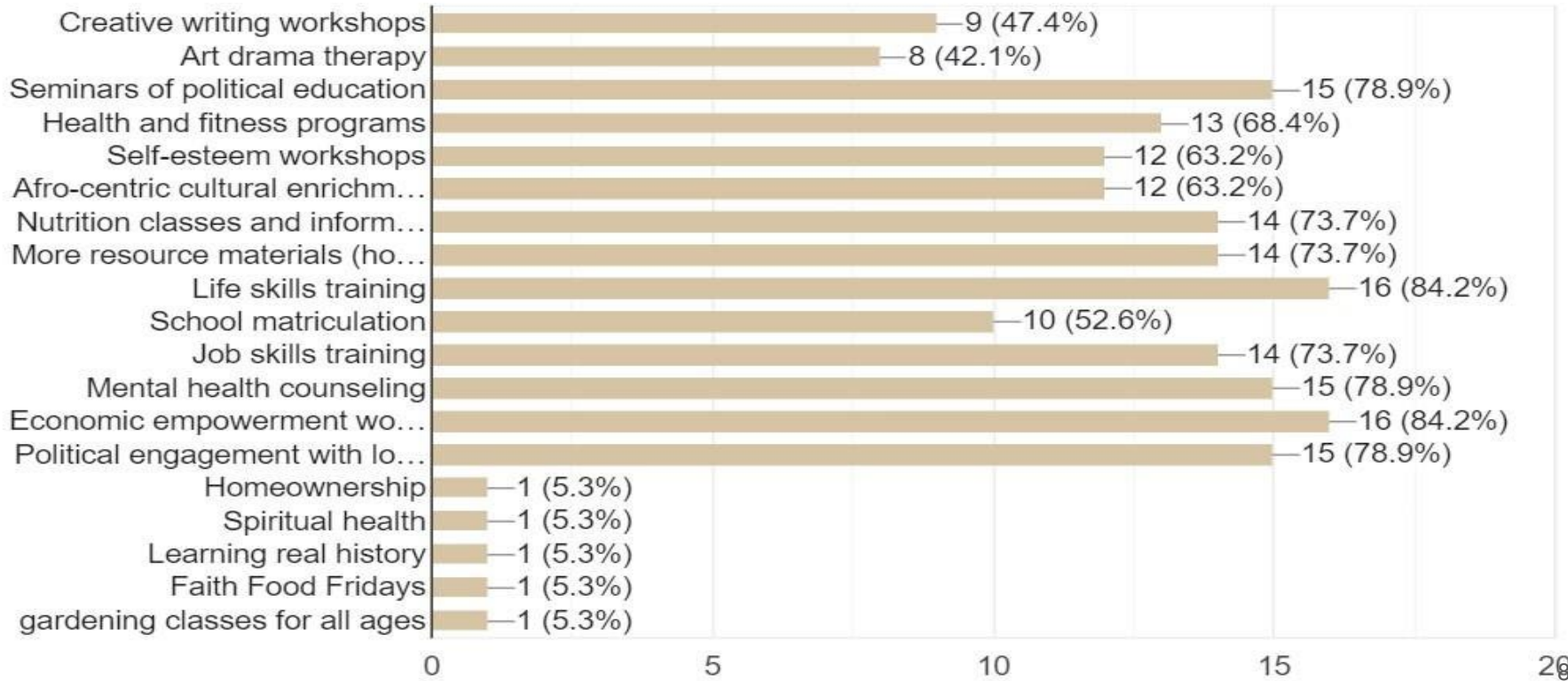
The Work Done So Far
