Jennifer Mason McAward is an associate professor of law at Notre Dame Law School, and the Director of the Klau Institute for Civil and Human Rights at Notre Dame's Keough School of Global Affairs. She received her undergraduate degree summa cum laude from Notre Dame in 1994, majoring in Government and International Relations and minoring in Theology. Following law school, Professor Mason McAward served as a law clerk for Judge Alex Kozinski on the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit and then for United States Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor. Her scholarship has explored the history of the Reconstruction Amendments and the scope of Congress's power to pass legislation to enforce the Thirteenth Amendment.
